

*Growing Conditions:* Cool growing season, warm fall. Average rainfall

*Vineyard Operations:* Spur pruned, Vertical shoot positioned, green bunch removal

### VINIFICATION

100% of the wine will receive malolactic fermentation and is barrel-aged for 18 months in new, medium and neutral French Oak Barrels. Once bottled, the wine was aged for another 16 months before release. **CELLARING** Drink within 5-7 years.



### Accolades

### 92 points - John Schreiner

Dark in hue, the wine begins with seductively sweet aromas of cassis and blackberry. On the palate, the wine has flavours of plum, cassis, and vanilla. There is a hint of coffee and tobacco on the finish, as well as a touch of mint. The bright flavours and the moderately angular texture reflect the cool vintage. Nevertheless, this is a well-grown, elegant and satisfying red.

### 89 points - Beppi Crosariol - The Globe & Mail

The blend leans toward the model of Bordeaux's right bank: cabernet franc and merlot with some cabernet sauvignon and petit verdot. It displays considerable savouriness for a New World red blend, too. Full-bodied, it's simultaneously dry and juicy, with dark, tangy plum and cherry jam infused with cigarbox and mildly astringent tannins. Brilliant for roast lamb.
